Scan to pay or show your payment QR code when you make the payment.

Notes:

- When binding an international bank card to Alipay or WeChat, it is necessary to obtain authorization from the foreign issuing bank. However, some issuing banks may reject the binding request due to their system's inability to recognize the connection information. In such cases, it is advisable to contact the issuing bank's customer service center or consider using a Chinese bank card instead.
- When using Alipay or WeChat for QR code payments through the bound international bank card, users are not required to pay an additional service fee if the transaction amount does not exceed RMB 200. Users need to pay a service fee of 3% of the transaction amount if the amount exceeds RMB 200.
- Alipay and WeChat have transaction limits for bound international bank cards, with an annual limit of USD 50,000 and a single transaction limit of USD 5,000. It is recommended that users who have bound international bank cards to the Apps take into account their specific use cases before using mobile payment.

4. 3 Guling (Kuliang) Tourist Resort

Guling (Kuliang) National Tourist Resort is situated in the eastern suburbs of Fuzhou, the capital of Fujian Province, about 12 kilometers away from the downtown area. It boasts an average altitude of 750 meters and an average summer temperature below 30 degrees Celsius. Renowned for its cool breeze, thin mist, cedar trees, and ancient houses, Guling has been known as a popular tourist destination and a summer resort since antiquity. Starting from 1886, people from over 20 countries including the United Kingdom, the United States, France began building villas in Guling. With 366 villas of various styles in its heyday, Guling emerged as an international community where Chinese and Western residents lived in harmony together and the two cultures blended harmoniously.

During his visit to the United States in February 2012, then Vice President Xi Jinping shared the "Kuliang story" of Fuzhou, which made Guling renowned at home and abroad. On June 28, 2023, President Xi Jinping sent a congratulatory letter to the Bond with Kuliang: 2023 China-U.S. People-to-People Friendship Forum. He stressed that "amity between the people holds the key to sound relations between countries, and the people are the cornerstone of the growth of state-to-state relations. I hope that you will continue to write the Kuliang story and carry forward the friendly sentiment it embodies, so that the friendship between the two peoples will continue to grow and thrive like the millennia-old cedartrees in Guling."

4. 4 Yantaishan Historic District

Yantaishan Historic District, located at the bridgehead of Nantai Island, is on a 41.6-meter-high hill. After Fuzhou was opened to foreign trade in 1844, many Western merchants and missionaries came to the city. They built houses on rented land to open firms, schools and hospitals and set up consulates and offices of the chargé d'affaires around Cangqian Hill on Nantai Island, forming a "Cangqian community for foreign expatriates". At the center of the community, Yantai Hill housed 17 consulates and offices of the chargé d'affaires, 33 foreign firms, 8 churches, 3 mission hospitals and 11 mission schools.

Today, known as the "Museum of World Architecture", Yantaishan Historic District is home to 191 cultural-relic, historical, and traditional buildings. It is also an important witness to the modern urban development of Fuzhou.

Port handles a cargo throughput of over 300 million tons annually, ranking among the top 20 worldwide. The Fuzhou Changle International Airport now runs 115 domestic and international air routes, with an annual passenger throughput of more than 10 million.

Fuzhou boasts a thriving economy and broad development prospects.

It has been granted preferential policies by the central government including the Demonstration Zone for Integrated Cross-Strait Development, Fuzhou New Area, Core Area of the Maritime Silk Road, Fuzhou Area of China (Fujian) Pilot Free Trade Zone, National Pilot Zone for Ecological Conservation, National Independent Innovation Demonstration Zone, and Demonstration Zone of Marine Economy Development. The China-Indonesia "Two Countries, Twin Parks" project stands as a flagship project engaged in high-quality Belt and Road cooperation. Fuzhou boasts 6 100-billion-yuan industries and 19 enterprises with an annual revenue of over 10 billion yuan. In 2023, its GDP exceeded 1.29 trillion yuan, with an increase of 5.2%. Since the start of reform and opening up, Fuzhou has utilized an actual foreign investment of over 29 billion dollars.

Fuzhou is close to Taiwan, home to many overseas Chinese, and boasts a high level of openness.


Over 4.3 million overseas Chinese of Fuzhou ancestry live and work in more than 170 countries and regions worldwide. There are more than 800 thousand people of Fuzhou origin living in Taiwan, playing a crucial role in promoting cross-strait integration and opening up. The city invests in and trades with over 200 countries and regions. It has established friendship city relationship with 23 foreign cities, enlarging an international circle of friends.

Fuzhou has beautiful natural landscapes.

As a riverfront and coastal city, Fuzhou features a pleasant environment and climate. It is home to major national scenic spots such as Gushan Mountain and Qingyun Mountain, 5A tourist attraction Three Lanes and Seven Alleys, over 150 famous historic sites, and 37 gardens of various types. It ranks second among Chinese provincial capitals in forest coverage and fourth among 168 major Chinese cities in air quality.

In recent years, Fuzhou has vigorously promoted the digital economy, marine economy, green economy, and culture and tourism economy, with a focus on building itself into a smart, open, green, and livable city brimming with innovation and vitality. In addition, Fuzhou has won the China "Internet Plus Government Services" Innovation Award and the first Global Award for Sustainable Development in Cities.





4. 1 Fujian Province

Fujian Province, briefly named Min, is situated on China's southeast coast with Fuzhou as its provincial seat. Covering a land area of 124,000 km² and a sea area of 136,000 km², it has a population of 41.83 million and exercises jurisdiction over nine prefectural cities (Fuzhou, Xiamen, Zhangzhou, Quanzhou, Sanming, Putian, Nanping, Longyan, Ningde), Pingtan Comprehensive Pilot Zone, and 85 counties (or cities at county level) and districts.

Fujian is endowed with rich natural resources.

With a forest coverage rate of 65.12%, Fujian has been the greenest province nationwide for 45 consecutive years. The province has the second longest coastline in China that stretches 3,667 kilometers, including 258 kilometers of deep-water coastline that can accommodate 10,000-tonnage berths, one of the longest in China. It boasts the most abundant hydropower resources in East China.

Fujian has a well-developed transport network.

The overall road traffic network in operation exceeds 121,800 kilometers. The modern port cluster along the southeast coast was basically completed with 3 large ports of 100-million-ton throughput. Ports in Fujian handle more than 700 million tons of cargo annually and can accommodate the largest vessels in the world. The Silk Road Maritime Association continues to welcome new members. Fujian has six airports with air routes to major cities around the world. In the years to come, Fujian will develop even closer ties with the world, when the second phase of Fuzhou Changle International Airport and the new airport in Xiamen go into service.

Fujian is steeped in history and culture.

It is home to Mount Wuyi (World Natural and Cultural Heritage Site), Kulangsu Island (World Cultural Heritage Site), Fujian Tulou (World Cultural Heritage Site) and Quanzhou: Emporium of the World in Song-Yuan China (World Cultural Heritage Site). Fujian nurtures distinctive cultures such as tea economy, history of the Maritime Silk Road, lifestyles peculiar to people in Minnan (South Fujian) and "Fu (good fortune)" cultures.

Fujian boasts an advantage of opening up.



With a long history of foreign exchanges and a high degree of economic extroversion, it is one of the earliest provinces in China to start trading with foreign countries. Quanzhou, the starting point of the ancient Maritime Silk Road, was a world-renowned commercial port back to Song-Yuan Dynasties. Fuzhou was one of the places where Zheng He's fleet berthed. Fujian enjoys the edge of multiple zones such as the Special Economic Zone, Free Trade Pilot Zone, Comprehensive Pilot Zone, and the core area of the 21st Century Maritime Silk Road. It has established economic and trade ties with 220 countries and regions as well as friendship relationships with 125 provinces, states and cities in 47 countries. Fujian is home to 15.8 million overseas Chinese.

During his tenure in Fujian for 17 and a half years, Xi Jinping, President of the People's Republic of China, personally led and advanced Fujian's reform, opening up, and modernization, leaving us an invaluable legacy of thoughts and practices. In 2023, Fujian's GDP reached 5.4 trillion RMB, an increase of 4.5% over the previous year, ranking 8th in China. Its per capita GDP registered 130,000 RMB, ranking 4th nationwide. Its total volume offoreign trade stood at 1.97 trillion RMB.

4. 2 Fuzhou City

Fuzhou, also known as the city of banyans, is the capital of Fujian Province. As a renowned Chinese historic and cultural city, Fuzhou covers a total area of 12,000 km² and is home to a permanent population of 8.47 million.

Fuzhou has a long history and rich cultural heritage.



With a history of more than 2,200 years and a spirit of inclusiveness, Fuzhou has given birth to the Mindu culture characterized by the Tanshishan Culture, Fujian Naval and Shipbuilding Culture, Three Lanes and Seven Alleys, and Shoushan Stone Culture. The city has produced a galaxy of outstanding figures.

Fuzhou features convenient transportation and a unique geographical location.



Located in the southeastern part of China, Fuzhou faces Taiwan across the Strait, stands close to Hong Kong and Macao, and has a close relationship with Southeast Asian countries. Its multi-dimensional and integrated sea, land, and air transport network has continued to improve. As one of 25 major Chinese coastal ports, Fuzhou



3. 1 Chinese People's Association for Friendship with Foreign Countries

The Chinese People's Association for Friendship with Foreign Countries (CPAFFC), founded in 1954, is a national people's organization engaged in people-to-people diplomacy of the People's Republic of China. The aims of the Association are to enhance people's friendship, further international cooperation, safeguard world peace and promote common development. On behalf of the Chinese people, CPAFFC makes friends and deepens friendship in the international community and various countries around the world, lays and expands the social basis of friendly relations between China and other countries, and works for the cause of human progress and solidarity. Currently, CPAFFC has set up 46 China-regional or China-national friendship organizations and established relationship of friendly cooperation with nearly 413 non-government organizations and institutions in 157 countries.

3. 2 All-China Youth Federation

3.2.1 BriefIntroduction

Founded on May 4th, 1949, the All-China Youth Federation (ACYF) is a national umbrella organization for major youth organizations and institutions in China, reaching young people across China through its member organizations in 31 provinces, autonomous regions and municipalities directly under the central government, as well as a network of local youth federations in 300 cities, prefectures, and autonomous prefectures.

Its major functions are: to maintain close ties with youth organizations, youth movements and young leaders; to participate in democratic consultation, decision-making and oversight; to advocate for youth policies; to coordinate and implement national youth development plan; to implement youth engagement and youth development programs; to promote international exchange and cooperation.

3.2.2 Organizational Setup



ACYF has 14 national member organizations, 31 regional member organizations and 4 sectoral member organizations. National member organizations include: Communist Youth League of China (CYLC), All-China Students' Federation (ACSF), Chinese Young Men's Christian Association (CYMCA), Chinese Young Women's Christian Association (CYWCA), Chinese Young Entrepreneurs Association (CYEA), Chinese Association of Young Township Entrepreneurs (CAYTE), Chinese Association of Young Scientists and Technicians (CAYST), Chinese Young Volunteers Association (CYVA), Chinese Society for Juvenile Studies (CSJS), Chinese Youth New Media Association (CYNMA), China National Youth Palaces Association (CNYPA), China Youth Development Foundation (CYDF), China Guanghua Foundation (GHF), and China Youth Entrepreneurship and Employment Foundation (CYEEF).

3.2.3 International Cooperation

ACYF is committed to promoting international exchanges among youth organizations, youth workers and young leaders, actively participating in and hosting international conferences and events related to youth issues, actively supporting the UN 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development, and promoting international youth development programs.

ACYF was awarded the 'Human Resources Development Award' by UNESCAP in 1999, the 'World Youth Award' by UN in 2000, the 'Champion of the Earth Award' by UNEP in 2004, the 'Environmental Leadership Award' of the Billion Tree Campaign by UNEP in 2008. Its member organization Chinese Young Volunteers Association was granted as 'Special Consultative Status' to the ECOSOC in 2010.
